## Classrooms are busy places.....

Two of the most bustling times during the school day happen at the beginning when children are excited to communicate news to teachers and at the end when teachers have to make sure that students are ready to go home with all the materials they need. Potentially, with an average of 15 students in a classroom, that could mean a lot of interruptions in instructional time.

It is for these reasons that we request that parents not go to classrooms unless an appointment with a teacher has been made. Please try to help your child organize his/her day before coming to school and to make sure he/she has all that is needed for the day. We know that plans change now and then, but if there is such a change of plans and you have a message to give or something to drop off we gladly will deliver it from the office.
