Response to Intervention (RTI)

One of the ways that BHCS provides the highest quality of education for every student is through a three-tiered approach to instruction. This process known as **RTI** provides additional support beyond the core curriculum. Students receiving supplemental interventions are monitored frequently to ensure that they are progressing. Tier 1 is differentiated classroom instruction. Students who are not progressing at a rate to meet end-of-year

benchmarks will be provided Tier 2 interventions in a small group or individually. Interventions occur for a minimum of 6 weeks, but may continue as needed to ensure student success in the core program. The instructional support team may make adjustments in the intervention plan based on the student's progress. The intervention may change, or the intensity and frequency of the intervention may change. The more intense level is considered Tier 3. Parents will be invited to team meetings and are encouraged to be active in their child's intervention plan.

MLTF Offers Free Dial-Up

Free dial-up home Internet access is available again this year for all 7th and 8th grade students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch cost. They have made the application and set-up procedures quick and easy in order to maximize the number of students participating in the program. This service is being provided through a cooperative agreement between Great Works Internet (GWI) and the Maine Learning Technology Foundation (MLTF), a privately funded non-profit organization that supports ancillary services associated with MLTI.

The BHCS Cross Country team ran their first meet at Bay School, competing with 6 schools. All of the BHCS boys placed in the top 35 places, earning points for their team and 5th place. Even though the Bay School had the top 3 places, the BHCS girls' team ran together as a team and won the meet! The A soccer team has played four games. BHCS won the Surry game, lost by one goal at Deer Isle, lost a tough game to Pemetec, and won the Bay School game. The B1 soccer team played the Bay School on Monday and won their first game. Our B2 soccer team played the A team from Sedgwick and lost a close game on Tuesday night.
