### ***Character Education Through Active Learning!***

Each year the 7<sup>th</sup> graders at BHCS attend Camp Kieve, a leadership camp in Nobleboro, Maine on Damariscotta Lake. This year they will go for the week of October 24<sup>th</sup>. It's a beautiful setting with comfortable lodgings and great, healthy food. Our 7<sup>th</sup> grade teachers accompany them and take part in activities, often discovering new things about each child that will help them through the year to make the educational programs optimal for the all the kids. It's a full week of team-building activities that remind students that they are an important part of any community and that their positive contributions are critical to the success of a group. Well-trained counselors guide students to address such topics as substance abuse, bullying and teasing, self-respect, teen issues of dating and body image, and so much more. Students write in logs and work cooperatively to address these issues with role-playing, brainstorming, and goal setting. There are quiet contemplative moments at the water's edge to reflect and write. There is an outdoor component that includes a ropes course that challenges kids to try what might seem impossible at first. I have seen students accomplish feats that they would never have imagined for themselves, but with the right support and tremendous attention to safety, they were able to succeed. This is often a life changing experience for the kids who go away that week as last year's 6<sup>th</sup> graders and come back as stronger, more confident and mature 7<sup>th</sup> graders. It is a good example of how important it is to educate the whole child. Have a great week, 7<sup>th</sup> graders!
