For 20 years, Blue Hill Consolidated School has enjoyed an influx of children who have had preschool experiences from the Peninsula Montessori School. These children have shared their joy and excitement for learning with all of us, and their contributions to our school have been very positive and influential. Elsa Marsh, the original founder of the Montessori program, has played a significant role at BHCS over the years as the beloved Montessori teacher and as a parent of three kids here. Sadly, the school will be officially closing on June 7th of this year. The school will be missed, but their staff recognizes that there are now “many wonderful preschool options on and around the Blue Hill Peninsula.” Blue Hill Consolidated School is also making plans to provide Pre-K for our children in the fall of 2014, but for now we want to say a big THANK YOU, to Elsa, her staff, and to the many kids of Peninsula Montessori School. There will be a celebration at Peninsula Montessori on June 7th, starting at 11:30 AM; that same night, there will be another celebration here at BHCS from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM. Please join us.
