We've given the "Peanut/Nut ONLY" table in the cafeteria a reasonable amount of time to be able to determine the effectiveness and the degree of safety it provides to students with food allergies that include peanuts/nuts. The long and

short of it is that it is not the safest way to protect the allergic students. For that reason, the decision has been made to go back to the "Peanut/Nut FREE" table again. Anyone with nut/peanut allergies will have the choice to sit at this table and invite any friends who have HOT lunch to sit with them. Our cooks do not serve any foods with nut/peanut ingredients. Students with cold lunch will be able to sit at all the other tables. Classroom and field-trip precautions will remain in effect for the individual classrooms that have a student with peanut/nut allergies. For the safety and well-being of all people who attend and/or visit our school, we will always encourage awareness and careful consideration when choosing snacks and foods to send to the school. A caring and respectful attitude for the health and well-being of all our students is also encouraged and appreciated. Thank you for your attention and consideration to this announcement.
