Health Announcement: Flu Vaccination Clinics at BHCS

The single best way to protect your children from the flu is to get them vaccinated each year. CDC recommends that everyone 6 months of age and older get a seasonal flu vaccine.

The seasonal flu vaccine protects against the influenza viruses that will likely be the most common during this upcoming season. Blue Hill Consolidated School will be offering the flu vaccine for free to all students. The clinics will be conducted the week of October 28th to November 1st. An announcement and a packet of information about the types of flu vaccine that will be offered will be coming home in the mail next week. If you would like to have your child receive this vaccination please complete the Health Screening and Permission Form. Send it back to school as soon as possible.
