From the Principal - Leadership School

Many of you may know that BHCS has the outstanding tradition of sending our seventh graders to the Camp Kieve Leadership School each fall. The seventh graders attended Camp Kieve last week and had a fantastic time! I went down to spend the day with them on Thursday to check it out, as I had never been. What amazing facilities! I had the opportunity to see many of our students climbing the ropes and walls at their indoor climbing center. Students had a lot of success during this time. They worked together and cheered each other on. I even got to see one group achieve a Team Challenge that is reserved for high school groups called DaVinci's Bridge. They were given shaped wooden boards and dowels and asked to create a bridge that needed no suspension nor nails/connectors. It was truly incredible to watch this group of twelve students figure out such a difficult task.

Some of you may be wondering why we value this week, essentially a week away from our core classes, so I wanted to share with you some of the pieces of the curriculum students are getting there. There are seven pillars of instruction that take place both inside classrooms at Kieve as well as on their indoor and outdoor facilities. These are: communication skills, relationships, solo time, decision making, adventure, team building, and environmental stewardship; all part of the Guiding Principles of the Maine Learning Results. There are many more aspects of this experience than I can write about in this brief column, but one of the highlights for me is the idea that students are talking about the risky behavior that they see or anticipate seeing in high school and not only how they can avoid that behavior, but also what alternative positive risks might be. This is one of the purposes of the extensive adventure program utilizing both the outdoor ropes course and the indoor climbing center.

Camp Kieve is one of the best ways that BHCS fosters both mental and physical wellness. Our students are extremely fortunate to have dedicated teachers that spend the entire school week away from their families to facilitate this experience for them. Thank you Mrs. Davis and Mr. Snow!
