Not only was there an unexpected snowstorm to make this week unique, but there were also several unique and exciting learning experiences! To start, Grade 2 spent the day today in Brooksville, joining other 2nd graders from the area to study the history of our local Wabanaki Native Americans.

Students in grades K-4 relished an author day on Tuesday with Mary Cerullo who wrote *The Giant Squid*, *Shipwrecks* and other books about the ocean. Our own teachers' talents were utilized that day, too, as Nell Herrmann talked about ROV's (remotely operated vehicles) and her upcoming explorations in the Caribbean this summer; Penny Ricker helped students create exquisite nature journals; Tracy Gandy worked with students with fun ocean words; and Miss Nelson helped students perform expert squid dissections and write using the ink from the squid. Wow!

The 5th and 6th graders spent their Maine Student Book Award Day at Maine Maritime Academy in Castine on Wednesday as they celebrated Mary Cerullo's books, too. We appreciate the efforts of Nate Gandy who helped coordinate special experiences for the kids. Their activities included using the MMA navigation simulator, a tour of the State of Maine training vessel, boat rides, and hearing about North American Right Whales.

Our local librarians, including Beth Jackson, Rick Alexander, Helen Graikoski, Elizabeth Bruno, and Pat Horton of the Blue Hill Public Library who secured funds for the two days from the Rudman Family Grant, carefully planned all these events through the school year.

And, today...we had a very engaging presenter, Deborah Lipsky, who is an adult with autism. She kept our students' attention for a

solid hour with the story of her life and what it is like to be autistic. The students asked many perceptive questions, and they appreciated her honest answers. Deborah had also presented her colorful story on Wednesday night for the public. Her talk was enlightening for all of us, and gave a perspective of autism that was truly genuine and endearing. Thanks to Making Strides, this was all possible as a special event during Autism Awareness Month.

Science Excitement

Students aged 10 to 18 are invited to attend a free workshop in Stonington on Wednesday, April 23 to learn how to map local eelgrass beds. The three-hour workshop will take place at the Penobscot East Resource Center starting at 10 AM. Free lunch and snacks will be provided.

The Mount Desert Island Biological Laboratory will provide the training. The laboratory needs help this coming summer locating and observing eelgrass beds around Deer Isle. The task will involve reporting the location of active beds, or reporting that eelgrass is missing where beds existed in the past.

Scientists fear eelgrass along the Maine coast is vanishing, which is a concern among fishermen and clammers because the marine plant provides essential habitat for clams, lobster and valuable fish. For more information or to
