MEA Testing Results

Last Spring, third through eighth grade and third year high school students throughout Maine took the MEA Mathematics and English Language Arts/Literacy assessment. You may remember that two years ago, the state of Maine stopped using the NECAP (New England Common Assessment Program) tests and switched to the Smarter Balanced Assessment, which was basically a disaster. This caused the Maine Department of Education to find a new assessment, the MEA Math and ELA test through the company Measured Progress. The Department of Education had initially promised a quick turnover of scores for the new MEA that would be ready sometime in the summer of 2016 after the testing in the spring, but the data was actually released to schools just recently.


Overall, our scores were very favorable for this pilot year of testing. In English Language Arts, the state average for students who met or exceeded the standards was 46%, the BHCS average was 61% (#43 out of 188 schools in Maine counted). In Math, the state average for students who met or exceeded standards was 39%, the BHCS average was 51% (#23 out of 183 schools in Maine counted). In Science, the state average for students who met or exceeded standards was 51%, the BHCS average was 71% (#23 out of 152 schools in Maine counted). Individual student scores should become available at the end of January and will be sent home to you when we have them.
